1. Rationale

1.1. Khalil Gibran School believes that there are many benefits to having a consistent and recognisable uniform:

- 1.1.1. It allows for easy identification of students, essential for effective safeguarding;
- 1.1.2. It instils pride and gives students a sense of belonging;
- 1.1.3. It establishes and reinforces positive expectations of students, which supports positive behaviour and high achievement;
- 1.1.4. It helps students to understand the importance of presentation;
- 1.1.5. It protects students from social pressures to dress in particular ways, and prevents competition between students over clothing and fashion.

2. School Uniform Expectations

- 2.1.** Our uniform is smart and practical for the local environment. It is expected to be worn correctly at all times, so that students look smart and presentable.
- 2.1.1. Buttons fastened appropriately - second button below collar
 - 2.1.2. Sleeves not rolled up on long or short sleeved shirts
 - 2.1.3. Collar down
 - 2.1.4. Skirts must touch the centre of the knee
 - 2.1.5. Hoods must not be worn at any time on the school campus
 - 2.1.6. For students who wear a hijab, we request that they are plain and either navy, grey or white in colour.
 - 2.1.7. A sports hijab may be worn for physical education lessons.
- 2.2. ALL** items of clothing should be clearly marked with the child's name.
- 2.3.** Only KGS branded jumpers may be worn to school.
- 2.3.1. Any additional KGS branded items purchased for sports or school trips may only be worn for the specific event, **NOT** worn to school as uniform.
 - 2.3.2. Non-KGS branded jumpers, hoodies, cardigans or alternatives are not permitted on the school campus.
- 2.4.** If a student wears a coat to school when it is cold, it should be removed once inside the classroom.
- 2.5.** Hats, whilst acceptable and expected to be worn outside in the sun, must not be worn inside the classroom.
- 2.6.** Makeup - none is permitted from FS1 to Year 11.
- 2.6.1. For sixth form, light make-up should be discreet. No false eyelashes are permitted.
 - 2.6.1.1. Heads of Section are provided with makeup remover for any student who is asked to remove makeup.
- 2.7.** Nails – false or painted nails are not permitted from FS1 to Year 13.
- 2.8.** Heads of Section are provided with nail polish remover for any student who is asked to remove nail polish.
- 2.9.** Jewellery - FS1 to Year 13- a pendant or necklace is permitted **if kept out of view**; no other jewellery is permitted.
- 2.9.1. No other jewellery, such as rings or bracelets, should be worn at any time during the school day.
- 2.10.** Earrings - one pair of stud earrings allowed; these **MUST** be removed for PE lessons.
- 2.10.1. No hanging or hooped earrings are permitted.
 - 2.10.2. No other piercings are permitted during the school day.
- 2.11.** Hair - Hair should not obscure the eyes.
- 2.11.1. No bright hair dye or extreme hair styles are permitted.
- 2.12.** Earphones and mobile phones - removed/put away at all times between 08 am to 3:30 pm Refer to the Use of [Mobile Phone Policy](#) for further details.
- 2.13.** On days when PE is timetabled, we ask all students to arrive at school in their KGS PE kit.

3. Footwear

3.1. Footwear, from FS1 to Year 13, must be **plain black**, containing no visible logos or designs.

3.1.1. Boots, open toed sandals or loose-fitting slip-on shoes may not be worn.

3.1.2. No white soles or other colours

4. FS1, FS2, Years 1

4.1. Girls

- 4.1.1. Blue KGS Polo shirt (short or long sleeves) with KGS logo; navy blue skirts or trousers;
- 4.1.2. White socks, short or long as preferred;
- 4.1.3. Plain black shoes;
- 4.1.4. Optional: Navy blue or black tights; KGS navy blue V-necked sweater and KGS jacket.

4.2. Boys

- 4.2.1. Blue KGS Polo shirt (short or long sleeves) with KGS logo; navy blue shorts or trousers;
- 4.2.2. White socks, short or long as preferred;
- 4.2.3. Plain black shoes;
- 4.2.4. Optional: Navy blue or black; KGS navy blue V-necked sweater and KGS jacket



5. Years 2,3, 4,5 and

5.1. Girls

- 5.1.1. Blue KGS Polo shirt (short or long sleeves) with KGS logo; navy blue skirts or trousers;
- 5.1.2. White socks, short or long as preferred;
- 5.1.3. Plain black shoes;
- 5.1.4. Optional: Navy blue or black tights; KGS navy blue V-necked sweater and KGS jacket.

5.2. Boys

- 5.2.1. Blue KGS Polo shirt (short or long sleeves) with KGS logo; navy blue trousers or shorts up to year 3;
- 5.2.2. White socks, short or long as preferred;
- 5.2.3. Plain black shoes;
- 5.2.4. Optional: Navy blue or black; KGS navy blue V-necked sweater and KGS jacket.



6. Years 7, 8, 9, 10,11, 12 and 13

6.1. Girls

- 6.1.1. Blue KGS Polo shirt (short or long sleeves) with KGS logo; navy blue skirts or trousers;
- 6.1.2. White socks, short or long as preferred;
- 6.1.3. Plain black shoes;
- 6.1.4. Optional: Navy blue or black tights; KGS navy blue V-necked sweater and KGS jacket

6.2. Boys

- 6.2.1. Blue KGS Polo shirt (short or long sleeves) with KGS logo; navy blue trousers;
- 6.2.2. White socks, short or long as preferred;
- 6.2.3. Plain black shoes;
- 6.2.4. Optional: Navy blue or black; KGS navy blue V-necked sweater and KGS jacket.



7. PE Kit: FS1 to Year 13

7.1. PE

- 7.1.1. Regulation KGS PE T-shirt;
- 7.1.2. Knee-length KGS PE shorts or KGS tracksuit trousers;
- 7.1.3. Sports trainers that are appropriate for physical activity, any colour is permitted
- 7.1.4. Optional: Plain black or navy sports leggings (until KGS introduce KGS branded sports leggings)



8. Non-Uniform “Mufti” Days

8.1. At various times throughout an academic year, the school may hold “mufti days” where students are invited to come to school in their own clothes for a small fee for charity. Some days are annual and have a themed day, whereas others may be called as part of our ongoing commitment to charity work. Whether themed or not, students should follow our expectations and local customs by dressing appropriately, in line with the following guidance.

- 8.1.1. Clothing should be at least knee length and cover both shoulders.
- 8.1.2. Clothing should not expose flesh inappropriately, such as ripped jeans or a crop top.
- 8.1.3. No offensive words or images visible on clothing

9. Uniform infringements

9.1. Students dressed correctly and neatly can expect to be praised for taking pride in their appearance. Conversely, uniform infringements are treated as examples of negative behaviour, as per the [Behaviour Policy](#).

- 9.1.1. If a student comes to school without KGS uniform they will be required to return home. The student will be placed in internal suspension until they are collected by the parent/Guardian to correct the issue.
- 9.1.2. The same procedure applies to students who do not follow the guidelines for PE kit.

10. Parent cooperation with uniforms

10.1. Parents should take the following steps to support the school in upholding the uniform policy:

- 10.1.1. Respect the school’s policies and any sanctions that their son or daughter receives for not complying with the uniform policy;

10.2. Taking sensible steps to ensure that their son or daughter can comply with the uniform policy, such as:

- 10.2.1. Purchasing the correct items of uniform;
- 10.2.2. Checking that their son or daughter is in correct uniform before leaving the house in the morning;
